# Questions about Dual Credit

Will the courses transfer to the college or university of my choice?

All three universities are accredited, and their credits transfer to most colleges and universities across the country. Individual schools determine acceptance of transfer of dual credit courses. We encourage you to contact your school(s) of interest to determine if the credits will transfer.

If I took one of the approved courses in the past, can I still get college credit for it?

Unfortunately, you cannot receive college credit for a class you completed in the past. You must register for dual credit at the same time you are taking the class at SCS.

How is dual credit different from advanced placement (AP)?

AP courses prepare students to take an end-of-course exam. Many colleges and universities offer credit to students based on their performance on the AP exams. Dual credit offers college credit for the successful completion (C or higher) of a course. Each has its own pros and cons when it comes to post-secondary planning. Please contact your counselor if you have questions regarding AP and dual credit.
