1. Student Information & Parent/Guardian Consent

At Seattle Christian, we “proclaim Jesus Christ in all aspects of our program, emphasizing academic excellence and biblical Christian values, partnering with parents and the church to prepare godly young men and women so they may impact their world for Christ.”

One of these aspects is our commitment to stewarding what we have been given while in service to our neighbors. As such, students are expected to engage in a minimum of 10 hours of Community Service for every academic school year that they are enrolled at SCS High School. Every student will need to fulfill the following as part of their graduation requirements:

Community Service Requirements

- Beginning with the class of 2023, students are required to complete 10 hours of Community Service for every year that they are enrolled in SCS High School as part of their graduation requirements.
- Community Service hours may be completed through participation in community service activities coordinated by high school clubs and activity groups (ie. NHS, ASB, Mentorship, Athletics, etc.)
- Community Service hours are typically completed outside of school time, although various events and/or InterSCession trips may qualify. Additionally, the work must be voluntary in nature and not tied to any class credit or pay.
- Community Service may be completed each year in the summer leading up to the beginning of the academic year through 30 days prior to the last day of school.
- It is recommended that the community service be related to the students’ career exploration, church, or a cause that incorporates and aligns with the same biblical values as SCS.
- Community service projects must be pre-approved by the student’s parent/guardian and signed by an adult who has supervised the project.
- Community Service hours cannot be connected to any family member and must be done out in the community (for a neighbor, a local nonprofit, etc)

These projects are student and parent/guardian centered. Therefore, I assume all responsibility for any risks and/or costs that might be inherent in the activities my child chooses. Both my child and I also understand that falsifying or plagiarizing any part of the activities will negatively impact his/her graduation status.
