

ASB CANDIDATE APPLICATION

SPRING 2023

Associated Student Body (ASB) is a course for student leaders. It combines leadership training with hands on experience as you take ownership of student events and activities, communication, and promotion of a positive student culture at our school. We tie our learning and our leadership to three anchor statements:

- 1) We are all about **connecting students** to each other, to their teachers, and to activities and interests
- 2) We are all about **growing and modeling a positive, encouraging environment.**
- 3) We are all about **communicating clearly** (including seeking out and using feedback).

There will be 5-7 student leaders elected to ASB for the 2022-23 school year.

Minimum Qualifications

- A current freshman, sophomore, or junior
- Maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher with no D's or F's during the current year
- Has a history of mature and positive behavior both inside and outside the classroom
- Demonstrates consistent and timely attendance at school
- Is committed to upholding and to modeling the above anchor statements
- Is able to fit the class into her/his schedule without causing challenges to her/his progress toward graduation
- Parent approval

Application Requirements

- Complete and submit the application questionnaire to Mr. Althoff **by April 28th**. (reverse side of this page)
- Two recommendation forms from SCS faculty/staff members (forms provided)
- Mr. Althoff, Mr. Smidt, Mrs. Miller, and Mrs. Castaneda will review minimum qualifications for each applicant
- Mr. Althoff and Mr. Smidt will also discuss your application with your teachers to gain additional insight about your application.
- If a question or a concern arises during the application process, the applicant may be asked to have a conversation with Mr. Althoff and Mr. Smidt to discuss.

Application Approval

Once Mr. Althoff and Mr. Smidt have reviewed the applications, we will communicate with all applicants about the status of their application. If your application is not approved, we will meet with you individually to discuss the reasons why. If your application is approved, you will be invited to a follow-up meeting to review the campaign and election process.

Campaign and Election Overview

- Step 1* – Follow up meeting for all students approved to run for ASB
- Step 2* – Develop a campaign video highlighting your qualifications and commitments
- Step 3* – Videos will be shown during HS squad time
- Step 4* – Voting to take place during squad time after all videos are shown
- Step 5* – Announcement of 2023-24 ASB officers
- Step 6* – Spring training with current ASB
